What is a Fisher House?

- The Fisher House Foundation designs, constructs & furnishes housing for the family members & caretakers of injured military persons who are being treated as either inpatients or outpatients in a hospital setting.
- The houses are built using donated funds from the community, being situated on the grounds of major military centers, as well as at VA medical centers across the country.
- They are designed to offer all the amenities of home, being both comfortable & attractive. They include: a common kitchen, large dining & living rooms, laundry facilities, (21) attractive bedrooms with private bath, and even a library & toys for children.









The houses are free of charge: there is no charge to stay at a VA Fisher House.

Who can stay at the Fisher House?

Eligibility criteria:

- Guests must be medically stable and able to care for themselves and/or family members independently.
- Guest must live 50 miles or more from the Fisher House.
- Guests must require lodging for three (3) or more consecutive days.
- Minor children must be supervised by their families.
