





FINAL SALUTE TO 44 SAILORS AND SHIPMATES October 27, 1966

Oriskany departed San Diego for the Far East 26 May 1966, arriving Yokosuka, Japan 14 June. She steamed for "Dixie Station" off South Vietnam 27 June. Wearisome days and nights of combat shifted to "Yankee Station" in the Gulf of Tonkin 8 July. In the following months there were brief respites for replenishment in Subic Bay. PI. Then back into the action that saw her launch 7,794 combat sorties.

The Carrier was on station the morning on 27 October 1966 when a fire erupted on the starboard side of the ship's forward hanger bay and raced through five decks, claiming the lives of 44 men. Many who lost their lives were veteran combat pilots who had flown raids over Vietnam a few hours earlier. Oriskany had been put in danger when a magnesium parachute flare explored in the forward flare locker on Hanger Bay 1, beneath the carrier's flight deck. Her crewmen performed fantastic feats in jettisoning heavy bombs which lay within reach of the flames. Other men wheeled planes out of danger, rescued pilots, and helped quell the blaze through three hours of prompt and daring actions. Medical assistance was rushed to the carrier from sister carriers USS Constellation (CVA-64 and USS Franklin D. Roosevelt (CVA-42. Oriskany arrived back in the states 16 November 1966, and under went repairs in San Francisco Bay Naval Shipyards.

Patriot's Pen

We are involved in a youth-essay writing contest endorsed by the National Association of Secondary school Principal's contest criteria, is a nationwide competition that gives students in grades 6 thru 8 the opportunity to rite essays expressing their views on democracy. More than 115, 00 students participate in the contest. Contestants write a 300-400 word essay based on an annual patriotic theme. The first-place winner receives a \$10,000 saving bone and an all-expense -paid trip to Washington, DC. The top national winners each receive a savings bond anywhere from \$1,000 to \$10,000.

Voice Democracy Competition

The National Association of Broadcaster started the Voice of Democracy Scholarship in 1946. The Veterans of Foreign Wars became a national sponsor in 1950's and assumed sole responsibility for the program in 1961. The Voice of Democracy competition provides high school students freshmen thru senior grades the opportunity to write and record a broadcast script on a patriotic theme, competing for more than \$3 million in college scholarships and incentives. Department winner receive an expense paid trip to Washington, DC., during the VFW and Ladies Auxiliary Community Service Conference in March to enjoy our nation's capital and compete for scholarships ranging between \$1,00.00 and \$16,000.00, with the first place the first place winner receiving a \$30,00.00 scholarship.

Buddy Poppies

If you asked 10 people only one might know the story. Veteran's Day was originally Armistice Day, marking the end of the Great War. The Armistice was signed on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day on the eleventh month 1918. The poppies that the VFW soldiers sell date back to a poem written by Lt. Colonel John McCrae, a surgeon serving in the Canadian Army, titled In Flanders's Fields. Dr. McCrae wrote the poem after burying a friend in the spring of 1915, while noting thousands of wild poppies springing to life in the muddy cemetery. He discarded the poem but it was retrieved and soon published in Punch Magazine. He died in 1918 of pneumonia, but he lived to see his little poem help raise \$4000, 000.000 in a Canadian Victory Bond drive. In the 1920's Georgia teacher Moina Michaels started the tradition of selling paper poppies to raise money for memorial to honor slain soldiers. In 1923 the VFW began the tradition of selling the paper poppies, which were assembled by disabled vets who were paid for their work to provides a form of financial assistance. The VFW trademarked the name "Buddy" as an artificial flower, which guarantees every Buddy Poppy you buy since 1924 was hand-assembled by a disabled veteran in a VA hospital. The VFW sells paper poppies to raise funds for disabled veterans every November. Some people live a whole life time and wander if they made a difference
